Assurance

- **Key Scripture:** *1 John 5:13* – “I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God so that you may know that you have eternal life.”
- Assurance in salvation builds confidence, setting the foundation of faith necessary to begin the discipleship journey.

2. Consistency

- **Key Principle:** *You get nothing without consistency.*
- **Scripture:** *1 Corinthians 15:58* – “Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain.”
- Consistency in spiritual practices like prayer, study, and service develops resilience and fosters growth.

 - **Empowered Service:** *Matthew 5:16* – “In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.”

- **Scripture:** *2 Timothy 2:2* – “And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others.”
- **Reproduction of Faith:** *Matthew 28:19-20* – “Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you.”
- Spiritual maturity empowers believers to disciple others, fulfilling the goal of reproducing Christ-like servants.
